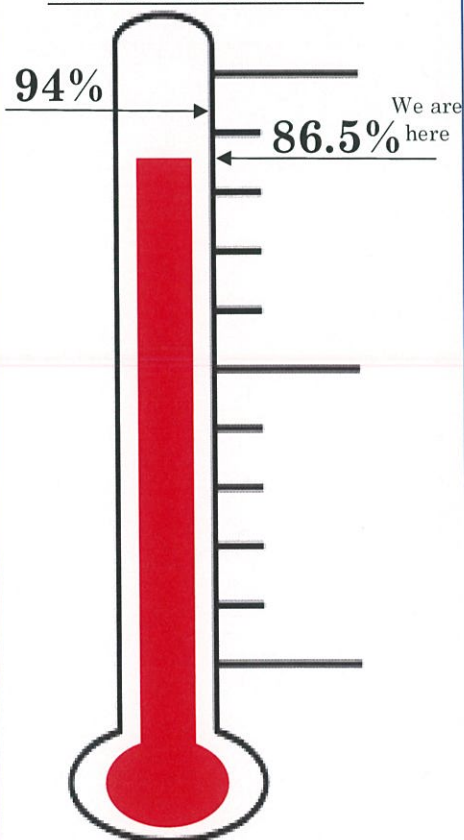

Principals Message

Dear parents, carers, family and friends,

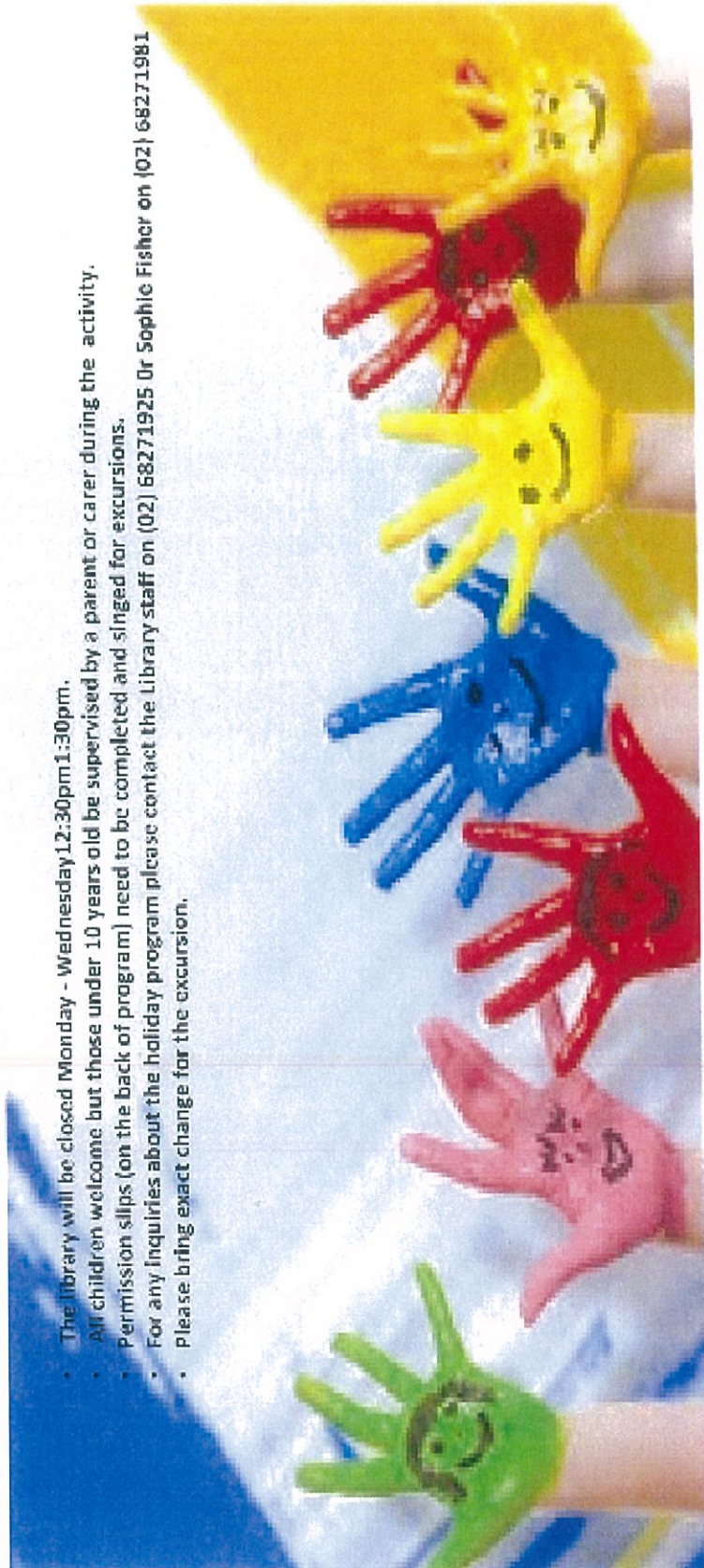

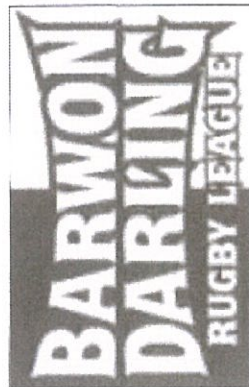
