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# From the Principal.....

Thank you to all the students and families who supported our school at the town ANZAC march. Unfortunately I was unable to be here this year due to a family commitment and I thank Mrs Robinson and Miss Hughes who accompanied the students during the service. We had a good attendance and I heard positive reports about the way our students represented the school. It is great to hear these good things about our students.

A special thanks to our captains, Marley and Teanna who spoke and laid our wreath.

## School Student Leaders for 2019

The school has revised and updated the processes for electing student leaders for 2019. This is a very important role in our school and Miss Smith will be working closely with year 5 to prepare them to become leaders. There will be some assistance with speech writing early in term 4.

Here is the essential criteria and role description from the school guidelines. Miss Smith or myself would be happy to answer any questions you may have.

### ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:

- *Demonstrates exemplary behaviour and therefore models the school expectations as a safe, respectful, learner.*
- *Has received no more than one major each term during the year with no suspensions or warnings of suspension for the whole year.*
- *Possesses strong communication and public speaking skills or displays a willingness to develop these skills.*
- *Takes on responsibility, volunteers and gets involved in a variety of school and community events.*
- *Works well as a team member.*
- *Shows the ability to make decisions for themselves (without peer pressure).*
- *Has shown a willingness to be involved in extracurricular activities e.g. choir.*
- *Proudly wears our school uniform.*
- *Maintains an attendance rate of at least 90% .*

### SCHOOL CAPTAIN'S RESPONSIBILITIES:

*As a school leader, students will be expected to exhibit certain behaviours and may be required to perform a range of duties. Some of those tasks could include:*

- *Being an active participant in the SRC.*
- *Presenting a leaders' report each week at our Friday assemblies.*
- *Welcoming and thanking guests, parents and dignitaries.*
- *Speaking in front of the school community at whole school events.*
- *Participating in extracurricular activities.*
- *Assisting new students to the school.*
- *Representing CPS at formal events such as the town ANZAC ceremony.*
- *Reporting to the Principal on issues that arise from SRC or other student bodies.*
- *Attending special events (like Young Leaders day).*

### Staffing and class changes

We have had a few changes in our staffing and movement of teachers and SLSOs due to a variety of reasons.

- Congratulations to Mrs Carolyn Jones who was successful in the EOI process to relieve as the fourth Assistant Principal in the school. Mrs Jones will lead the Preschool-Kindergarten hub.
- Welcome to Miss Rebecca Hunter who will be working in stage 3 as the hub teacher. Rebecca comes to us from Cobar and was in Hay before that. We hope she will enjoy her time here.
- Miss Kuhn will be teaching 4K for the remainder of the year. Miss Kuhn started the year as the Preschool-Kindergarten hub teacher but that role has changed to 2 days per week. Miss Kuhn is looking forward to teaching full time in year 4.
- Mrs Lorraine Keen will be the hub teacher in stage 2. This is the position that Mrs Keen was originally employed for so it is good that we are now able to place her in that role.
- Miss Eleanor Hanigan is now a qualified teacher and will be working at CPS 3 days a week as the Preschool-Kindergarten hub teacher (2 days) and covering teacher absences (1 day). Congratulations and welcome to Miss Hanigan. We know the students will enjoy having you back at our school as a teacher.
- Our year 3 class was quite small and we have moved a group of year 4 students in with year 3 and formed a composite 3/4 class which is taught by Mrs Mikayla McPhee.
- Mrs McMillan will be assisting in Kindergarten as the SLSO each Wednesday.

### ANZAC day at school

We will be holding our ANZAC service at school on this Friday instead of the usual assembly. It will commence at 10.45am on the grass around the flags unless the weather is not suitable. All parents, carers, families and friends are welcome and morning tea will be served in the community room for adults afterwards.

The SRC will lead the service and we thank Mr Schmierer for his coordination of this event. Please join us if you are able.

### STUDENTS WILL NOT ATTEND SCHOOL ON MONDAY 28<sup>th</sup> MAY 2018. IT IS OUR STAFF DEVELOPMENT DAY.

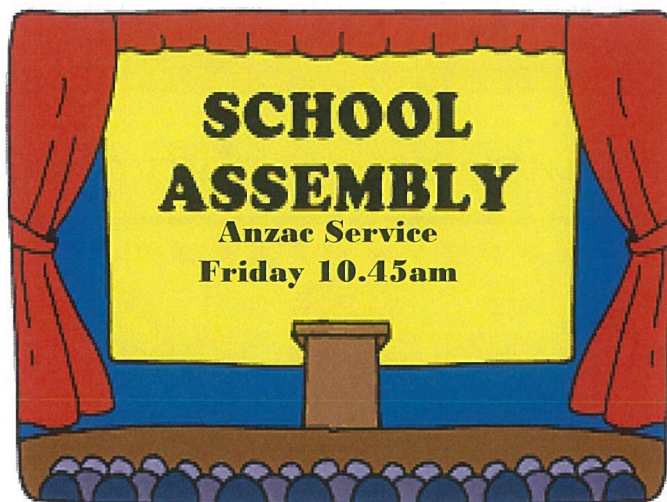

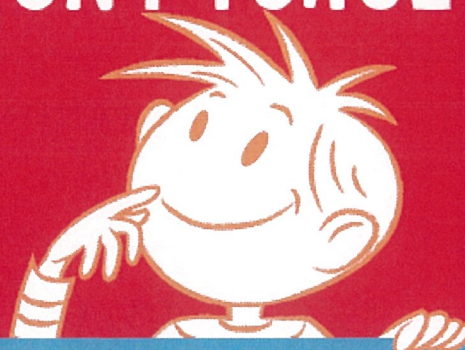
