From the Principal.....

Dear Parents and carers,

Warrumbungle Environmental Education Centre Sustainability Day – Thursday 7th June

Coonamble Public School will be hosting a Sustainability day this Thursday 7th June from 9:40am – 2:10pm. We have invited Quambone Public School to join us. The day is being organised by the Warrumbungle Environmental Education Centre at Coonabarabran. The students will be divided into 11 groups and participate in a variety of activities such as Taronga Zoo mobile, Community Greening, Red Hill EEC, Wambangalang EEC, Rumbalara EEC, ANU-Siding Spring, Warrumbungle EEC, Netwaste and Royal Botanic Gardens.

Professional Learning for teachers

This week several teachers have been involved in a MAPA (Management of Actual or Potential Aggression) Course. This program has been designed to enhance teachers understanding and management of disruptive, aggressive and/or violent behaviour and aims to ensure that everyone involved in a crisis situation, which includes disruptive, challenging or violent behaviour, can maintain the Care, Welfare, Safety and Security of all involved. Teachers are given the knowledge and skills to prevent, decelerate or de-escalate crisis situations and risk behaviours.

Bus Behaviour

It has been reported that several students have been misbehaving on buses and repeatedly while waiting in bus lines. A bus behaviour checklist will begin operating this week. Should students names be recorded over 3 days they will receive a major and be taken off the bus for 3 days. Please remind students to sit and wait in their bus lines each afternoon.

PB4L (Positive Behaviour for Learning) Program

The current focus for our PB4L program is on following instructions by choice. Students need to ensure that they are being responsible for making the right choice and following reasonable instructions to complete a task or activity. The students have been practising relaxation and calming activities after each break so that they are ready to commence work. One mindful activity is to sit quietly in a chair, hands in laps and think of 5 things you can see, 4 things you can touch, 3 things you can hear, 2 things you can smell and one thing you can taste. Students can also practice breathing in to the count of 3, hold to the count of 3 and breathe out slowly to the count of 7.

Interrelate Bullying Awareness Program

The students in Years 3- 6 participated in a Bullying Awareness Program last Friday, 1st June organised by Interrelate and run by School Safe educators from Orange.

Students were able to:

- explore respectful relationships with self, friends and family;
- enhance their self-esteem, communication and decision-making skills in relation to taking responsibility, taking care of themselves and respecting others;
- become aware of the influences on their personal choices and the potential consequences of those choices
- raise awareness of technology, including helping students to stay safe online and strategies to respond to cyber bullying and its consequences.

Learning Meetings

Thank you to those parents and carers who attended the Parent Information Session last Friday in the Community Room which explained the new reporting procedure. It was a great opportunity for parents and carers to ask questions and provide feedback.

Learning Meetings will be held next week. Please contact the school office to arrange a time to meet with your child's teacher. Students will meet with their teacher and parent/carer to demonstrate their learning achievements in Literacy and Numeracy and discuss their next steps to improve. Parents will receive a summary of achievement levels after the learning meetings. We believe that this process will provide a more accurate indication of student achievement and clarify expectations. We look forward to your feedback after the meetings so that we can make further improve our reporting process.

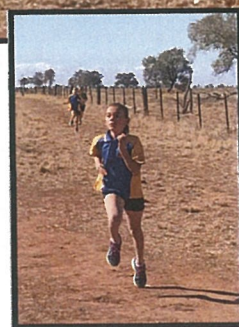
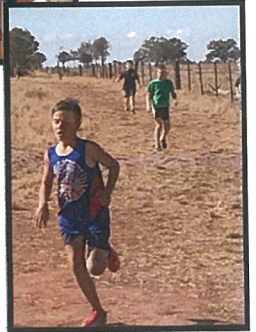
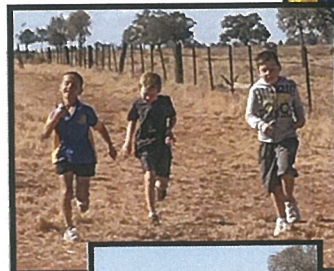
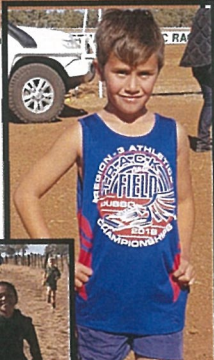

RECRUITING NOW for 2018

16 Week Indigenous Training & Employment Program

Commences 26th March 2018

- Three-week pre-vocational course covering handling livestock, penning sheep, farmhand skills and communication. Participants continue to receive Centrelink benefits.
- Participants who perform well will graduate to a 13-week work based training program. Award wages (Pastoral Award) will be paid.
 - Participants will learn all aspects of the Wool Industry and the participants will have shearing targets to meet.
 - Training will include other skills, such as mustering, crutching, wool handling, fencing and maintaining water troughs.
 - Successful participants will receive a Certificate II in Rural Operations.
- Participants are required to 'live' onsite and be prepared to live away from home for extended periods of time.
- Three wholesome meals a day provided, plus morning and afternoon 'smoko'.
- Age – preferably between 16yrs and 25yrs.
(Parental or guardian permission required for participants under 18yrs).
- Open to male & female applicants.
- Must have a genuine desire to work as a shearer or work in the wool industry.
- Must be willing to learn, take direction and be able to get along with others.
- Must be fit and able to undertake hard physical work.
- Merriman Station is a drug and alcohol-free property and random testing is undertaken throughout the Shearing School.

Prior to commencing in the program the applicant will be required to:

- Attend an interview with MEGT or Indigenous Land Corporation staff
- Undergo a Police Check and drug test.
- Successful applicants will be required to have the appropriate work wear and to be able to organise transport to the property which is 15 minutes South East of Brewarrina in NSW.



Wage details:

Participants will be paid as a Level 1 Farm and Livestock Hand, the current weekly Gross Wage being \$694.39, for a 38hrs week.

MEGT will make wage deductions as follows:

- \$127.53 per week for 'Keep' which covers the cost of food
- \$165.00 per week for Training Costs

After deductions, including Tax, each participant should have approximately \$306.00 each week to spend. Participants may decide to also allocate \$100 per week for a Shearers Kit – this is optional and will be discussed during the interview.
