From the Principal.....

Dear parents,

Thank you to all parents and carers who attended the learning meetings last week. I'm sure that you were provided with a good understanding of your child's learning achievements and what areas they need to work on next semester. We will be evaluating the process in the next few weeks so that we can make improvements for the term 4 reports. We will be asking students and teachers for their feedback as well. Thanks again for your participation, we know that our students really appreciate it when their parents and carers attend events at school.

Congratulations to our netball team who won their game on Monday. This team is committed to their training and they have worked well to achieve their success. They will progress to the next round of the competition so we wish them all the very best. Thanks to the coaches – Justine Powell and Jo Lee for their expertise and training the team to work well together.

Health Checks

It is that time of year when the AMS will conduct free health checks for our students. Notes have gone home for your permission and to make sure we have current information about you child/children. The health checks will be on Monday July 2nd, Tuesday 3rd and Wednesday 4th July. This is the last week of school. Please sign and return the notes to your class teacher as soon as possible.

Staffing.

We welcome Ms Sue Mason to our school for the next 8 weeks. Sue is a school counsellor and she is working at the high school and our school to assess and support students with counselling. She is also assisting teachers with strategies to support our students with additional learning needs in class and working closely with the learning support team. We hope sue really enjoys her time in Coonamble.

Behaviour of Students

Our school positive behaviour for learning data is showing that the majority of minor and major incidents across our school are for students not following instructions from teachers. This is occurring mainly in classrooms when students are asked to complete learning tasks and they refuse, become disruptive to the learning of others or leave the classroom and become unsafe. This has been the area of highest incidents all year and the school is working on how to address the issue.

It is really important that students follow the instructions of all staff- whether it is their classroom teacher, a hub teacher, a teacher filling in or other support staff. The classroom is for learning and teachers prepare lessons and activities to help students make progress. It is unfair to other students who are on task and completing their work when some students are interrupting that learning by calling out, leaving the room, arguing or displaying other disruptive behaviours.

Of course, it is not all students and the majority are working well. We acknowledge those students through our goldies system and other classroom processes.

If parents/carers receive phone calls or notifications from the school about this behaviour or your child is sent home because they are unsafe and refusing to complete their work, we ask that you support the school by talking through the concerns with your child and reinforcing the need to be in class and learning – no matter who the teacher is. We remind students that our school expectations are to be safe, respectful learners at all times in every situation.

If you have concerns about this, please make a time to talk with the teacher, the stage supervisor, the deputy principal (Mrs Peter) or myself. We want to resolve these concerns quickly so that all students are learning and the right to learn is available to every student and teachers can teach effectively without disruption. If students require additional support with their learning, we can also discuss that with our learning and support team.

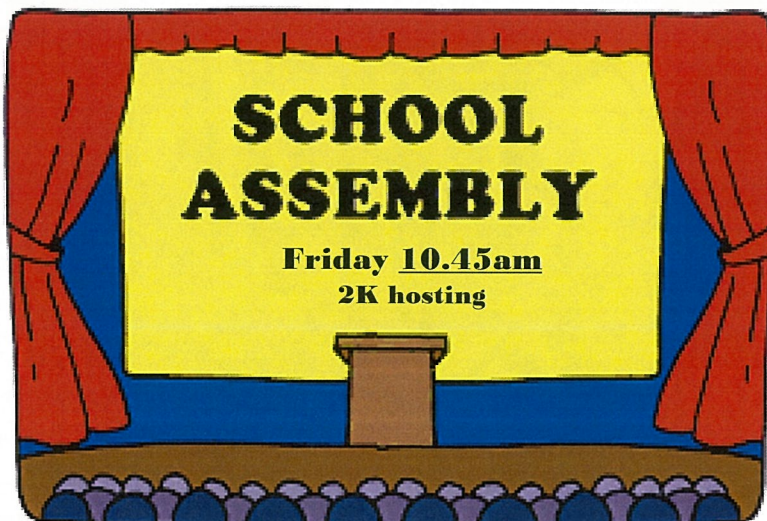

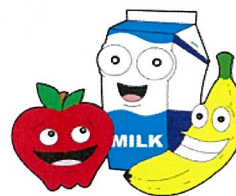

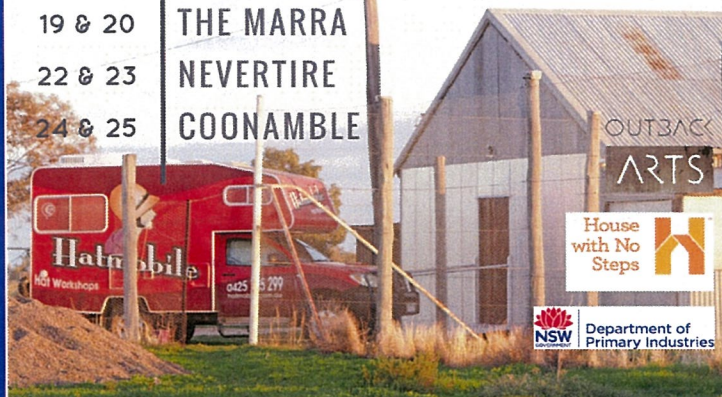
